Notice to Northwest Territories Fishers

- Aboriginal persons may fish without a licence by angling or by means of gillnet, set line, snares or dip nets, for food for themselves, their family or their dogs. All other persons require a licence to fish.
- Fish that is suitable for food cannot be wasted.
- All nets must have the name of the owner (or licence/vessel number for domestic/commercial fishers) clearly marked.
- At least one third of the stream must be left open to allow fish to pass.
- Nets must be checked every 30 hours in the summer (May 16th to October 31st) and every 72 hours in the winter (November 1st to May 15th)

Dettah and Ndilo Garbage

Just a reminder that there was a community clean up in Dettah and Ndilo. Please keep your yard clean and don't let debris blow onto your neighbor's lot. Let's keep our community nice and clean for all members.

Homeowners you are responsible to take your own yard garbage and large items to the dump on your own.

For the residents of Dettah, you can come to YKDFN Office to sign out the dump key for the Dettah dump. Akaitcho Bay trucking is not responsible for these items, please do not harass them. They ONLY pick up daily household garbage in regular size garbage bags. Yard and large items, furniture etc are not their responsibility.

In Ndilo: take your yard garbage and large items to the city dump, YKDFN and City is not responsible to pick up these.

Recycling has come to Dettah!













This summer a recycling centre was built in Dettah. It is currently located next to the Fire Hall. The bins at the centre take the same materials as the City's recycling program. Please see the brochure for more details.

The recyclable materials will be taken to the City's landfill for processing weekly or as required. The recycling project is part of a one year pilot project with the City of Yellowknife. The recycling centre was built with the funding support of the GNWT's Department of Environment and its Waste Reduction and Recycling Initiative.

The recycling centre can be moved. Please let us know if you have suggestions for a permanent location for the centre.

Chief and Council of the Yellowknives Dene First Nation are concerned about the number of dogs running loose in Ndilo and Dettah.

Because these loose dogs can form packs and can be a threat to the residents of Ndilo and Dettah, Chief and Council are asking all dog owners to tie-up their dogs and keep them tied-up at all times.

At their September 7, 2011 meeting, Chief and Council discussed the dogs issue and decided to give notice to all dog owners that effective immediately all loose dogs will be picked-up and disposed-off, as per council direction on September 7, 2011.

Yellowknives Dene First Nations staff will continue to pick-up and dispose-off loose dogs without further warning.

When you lose someone in death, go to the family right away, help out the widow as much as possible and help take care of the orphaned children.

Love each other as much as possible

Treat each other as brother and sisters as though you are related. Help each other and don't harm anyone.

Be respectful of Elders and everything around you

Don't run around when Elders are eating; sit down until they are finished.

Sleep at night and work during the day

Don't run around or laugh loudly when it gets dark. Everyone should sleep when darkness falls.

Be polite and don't argue with anyone

Don't harm anyone with your voice or actions. Don't hurt anyone with your power.

Don't show your anger.

Young girls and boys should behave respectfully

Don't make fun of each other, especially in the matter of sex. Don't make fun of older men and women. BE polite to each.

Pass on the Teachings

Elders are to tell stories about the past every day. In this way, young people learn to distinguish between good and unacceptable behaviours and when they are older, they will become the storytellers someday, who will then someday keep the circle of life going.

Be happy at all times

The creator have given you a great gift – Mother earth, take care of her and she will always give you food and shelter.

“Prepare the children for a good life by teaching them in this way – It is your responsibility”
